The students found him very relatable and funny and he had the students totally engaged.

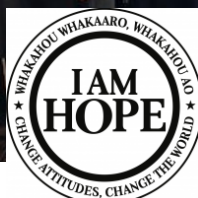

## Services Academy Bushcraft Course

Huntly College and 5 other Service Academies had the opportunity to participate in the Services Academy Bushcraft Course run by the NZ Defence Force during June 2018.

Throughout the week, the Huntly College Academy took part in multiple activities alongside other academies showing leadership, cooperation, commitment and self-discipline gaining the results we always strive for.

We constructed bivvies (improvised shelters) using the natural environment resources (pine needles, branches, tree bark etc.) it was a team building activity. We then slept overnight in our bivvies having to survive with nothing but a thermal mat to keep us dry, warm and off the ground. Sleeping in a bivvy was cold, uncomfortable and hard to adjust to. We had to become independent, to be able to survive; we also cooked our own food while living in a bivvy.

Overall this experience was the ultimate team work activity which was challenging and rewarding along with the experience of facing our fears resulting in our team becoming an even **STRONGER TEAM!!**

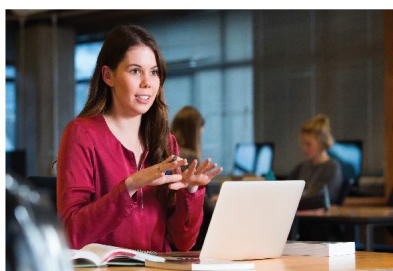
