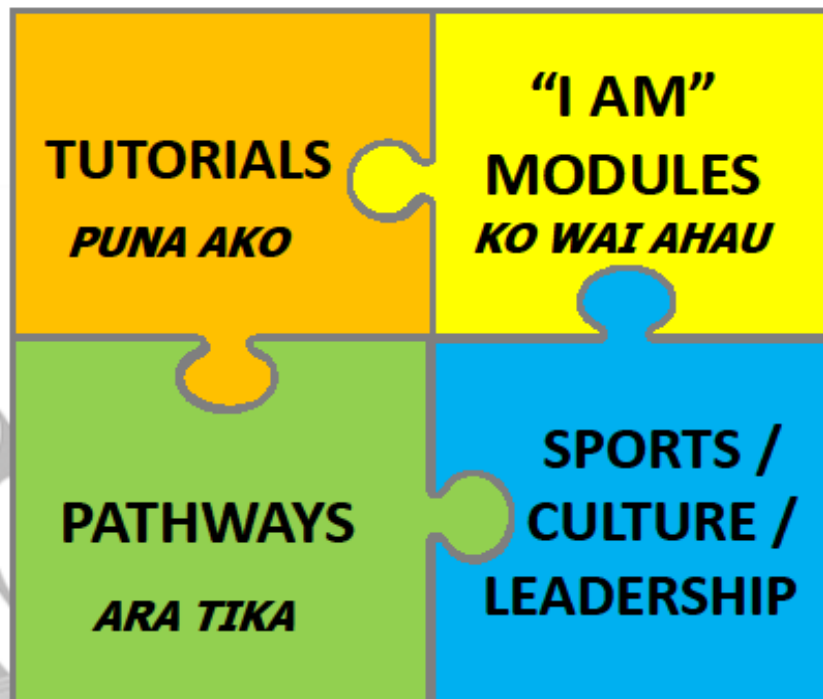

All students studying for their NCEA are required to pay a NZQA fee to receive recognition for their achievements.

Fee Structure for 2018 due 1 September 2018:

	Eligible for benefit-based or income-based assistance	Not eligible for benefit-based or income-based assistance
One child who is a candidate	\$20.00	Full fee - \$76.70
More than one child who are candidates	A maximum of \$30.00 per family	Where fees are payable for more than one candidate, a maximum of \$200.00 per fee payer.

We welcome parents/whanau to set up an 'Automatic Payment' to spread payments over the entire year. For further information, please make contact with our College Office.

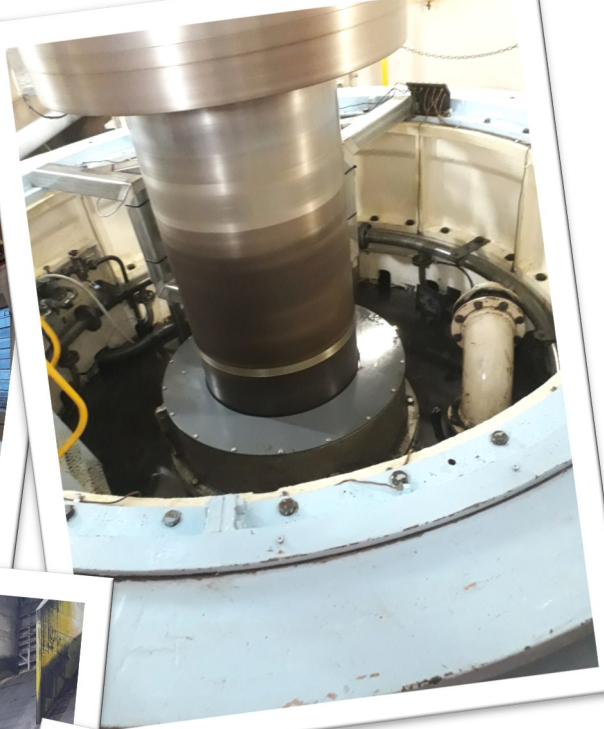

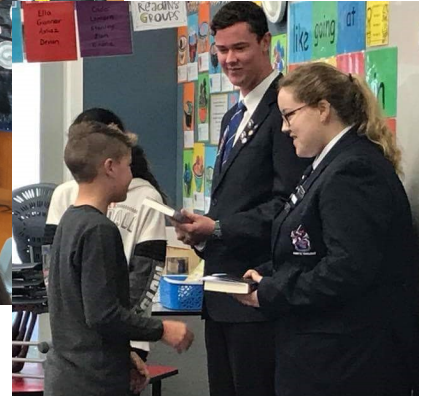
YEAR 9/10 MERCURY ENERGY KARAPIRO TRIP
