Monday 10th December 4pm: Huntly College

'Dr Melinda Webber is an Associate Professor at the University of Auckland. Her current research looks at the ways whānau, teachers and students themselves perceive and achieve success 'as Māori'. In her presentation she will discuss the findings of the Ka Awatea project: An iwi case study of Māori student success. In this study, the researchers identified eight key qualities that helped Māori students to achieve "success as Māori" and five underpinning developmental priorities. The projects are strengths-based and celebrate the innate potential of Maori students.'

Snacks, networking and a fantastic learning experience will be provided.

1. Working groups comprised of teachers, leaders, whanau and the community. The 6 groups are focused on Transition, Maori Identity, Hauora, Literacy and Numeracy, Authentic contexts for Learning and Community Partnerships
2. Learning Progression Frameworks - building a shared understanding of the writing progressions and how these improve consistency across our schools and better inform planning
3. Dr Ian Hunter Writing Programme - hugely successful in a large number of schools and Kāhui Ako across the country, we want students from Huntly to be exceptional writers
4. Oral Language - Sharing common practices that are working well, and new learning together on what makes the biggest impact on child development in oral language.

Message from the Academy Director

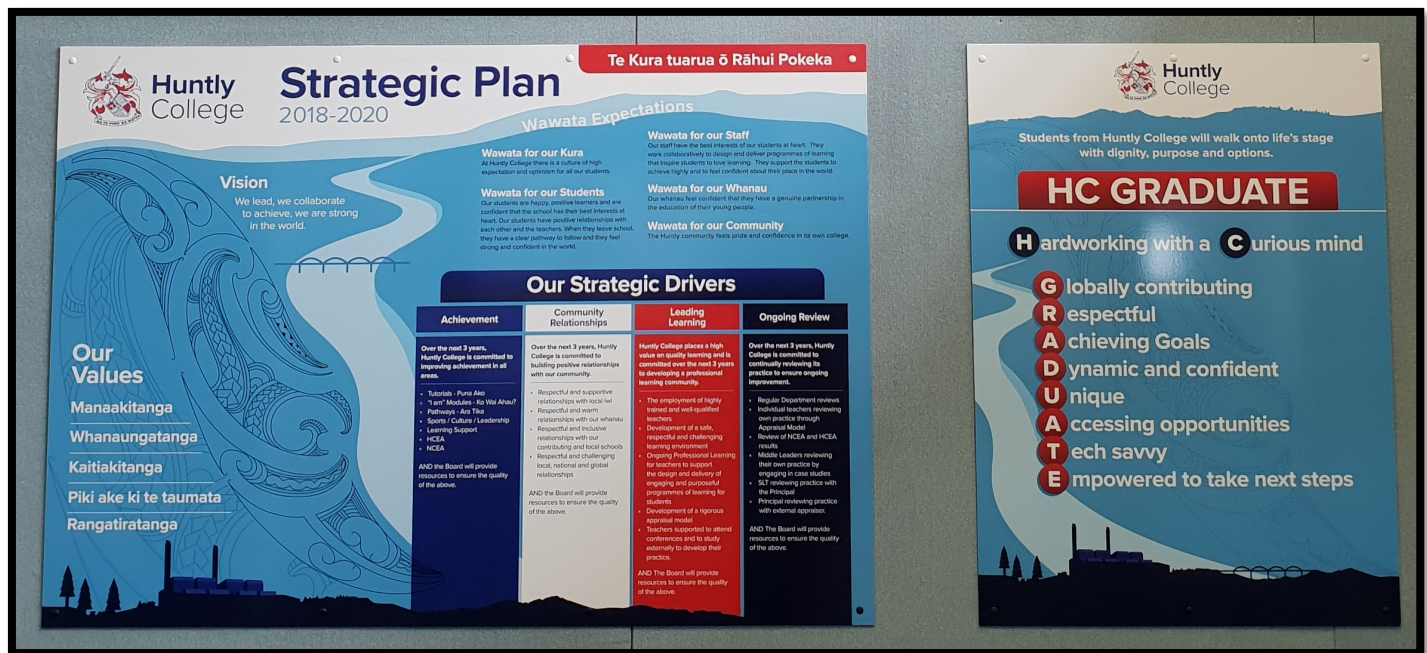
