Services Academy Bushcraft Course

Huntly College Services Academy camped at Hunua Falls from Tuesday 4th of June to Friday 7th of June. The Service Academy schools who joined us were Kelston Boys, Tangaroa College and Waitakere. Through this camp we learnt how to navigate using a compass, map and our surroundings. This was very important for us to learn as we were being assessed on this task.

Before we started our tramp, we had to walk 100 metres and count the amount of times we stepped onto our left foot. I took 51 steps. This was very helpful to us as we relied on the amount of steps we took and our surroundings to figure out where we were on a map.

During our tramping we were assessed on our navigating skills that we learnt the night before. It was an easier day on Day 3 because we had surroundings that we could rely on. On Day 1 we found it hard to distinguish the figures on the map that stood out to us. This was because there wasn't as much open areas like grass, hills and streams. The whole track was covered with vegetation giving us little but no view of anything but the trees in our way. Though this did not stop us from trying. It just meant we had to work harder and have a closer eye to detail. This tramp took us 6 hours to complete while carrying all of our equipment.



A highlight from camp was being able to spend 4 days in the outdoors. It was all so quiet and we could hear the animals at night time.

I enjoyed this camping experience as it was something I don't do often. Bushcraft pushed me to be a better leader. It gave me the opportunity to lead in activities, motivate my team, jump out of my comfort zone and let us all excel as one.

You can call us on 105 for all non emergencies, or you can go online at 105.police.govt.nz to report things like:

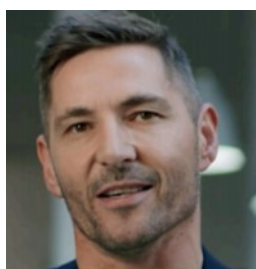
- Lost property

A small group of teachers and whaanau recently attended a hui hosted by the Morrinsville Kaahui Ako on "Understanding the Brain: The Big Picture". Nathan Wallis delivered professional learning which reflected the latest neuroscience discoveries and their practical implications for everyday life. Nathan shared his expertise on how our day-to-day interactions with children and young people, significantly in the early years, play a critical role in defining later outcomes for our children.
