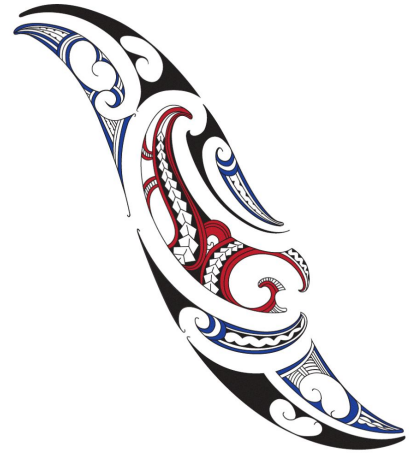


HUNTLY COLLEGE NEWSLETTER
